
President's Comments

Windows 10...Learn how to navigate in Microsoft's new operating system, add new apps as well as use them. Anyone taking this class should have a prior working knowledge of a Windows operating system.

Computer Basics (Windows 7)... Learn the fundamentals of using a Windows 7 computer. Learn to use various aspects of the Microsoft Word Processing program, including manipulating text and inserting graphics into a document. Basic filing, basic file management, and how to use a thumb drive are introduced. The final class of this course deals with the basics of email and use of the Internet.

File Management...Have you ever saved a file on your computer only to find out later that you could not remember where you put it and could not find it after searching for it? Then this class is designed for you. We will give you a deeper understanding of how to organize your documents and photos so that they are easier to retrieve. We will also assist you in organizing your own computer files. Flash drive required.

Students may use their own portable computers if they have the appropriate software installed (This is at the discretion of the instructor.) CKCS cannot provide copies of the proprietary software.

Cortana is part of Windows 10

To use Cortana with a desktop computer you need a microphone. I recommend a video camera because it

has a microphone built into it. You attach this to the top of your monitor and plug it into a USB port. They cost around \$40. Laptops don't need this as they have a built in video camera with microphone.



Windows 10 is free until July 29, 2016; after that date you pay over a \$100 for it. You should download it now; it is a great operating system.

Free up disk space


Delete unneeded files. Right click the Start button, left click File Explorer or This PC.

RIGHT click Local Disk (C:), left click Properties,.



Left click Disk Cleanup. Put a check mark in each one and click OK. These are all unneeded files. This will give you back a lot of disk space.

This works the same way in Windows 7 and Windows 8.1 Just start where you right click of the C Drive.



If your printer will not work after you upgrade to Windows 10:

Turn your printer on:

Go to Control Panel, click on Devices and Printers. If you see your printer there, it should have a check mark on it to signify that it is your default printer. If not Right Click your printer, click Set as default printer.

If the printer is not there, at the top click on Add a printer.

This is important to CKCS, because previous Kroger donations come close to paying one month's rent each year. Best yet, it costs the individual shopper nothing.


If you do shop at Kroger and have never set up an account to make this donation, that same Kroger employee is able to accomplish all of this for you, and is just a phone call away.

Be careful with the spelling of the name of a site; be careful with the first "findings" of the search engines; most times they are no findings but (many times deceptive) advertising.
- » If somebody call you about the "problems of your computer" simply hang off; they are not legitimate people so do not even waste your time even threatening them.

Friends, Family, Adventures - From your Camera to a CD


Using your pictures of your friends, family, a special event or a special trip, you can quickly make a CD to share.



SEPTEMBER TECH NIGHT

Barney Miller showed its skills in home entertainment

At the Tech Night show on September 14, Barney Miller, the owner of the historic Barney Millers store, exhibited the wealth of knowledge he has about home entertainment and home devices and

how to make all those work together. Barney, who was assisted by Donnie Allan, is the third generation owner of the 93-year-old business located in downtown Lexington.

During their presentation, they talked about online music streaming, which is replacing old fashioned sources of music such as CDs, tapes, and such.

They covered various remote control systems that not only replace all those individual remotes many of us have with a single remote. Some remotes can also control things like lights, shades, temperature, and security systems in your home – even when you are not home. They discussed home networks through which most everything works today. They regularly establish home networks for customers.

They talked about their installation of home theaters for customers, some built around the latest in TV sets – a 4K TV which is 4 times as many pixels as the latest high-dep TV sets. The

4K sets called "Ultra-High-Dep," produce extraordinary images which are as flawless like those seen by the human eye.

They mentioned the Dolby sound systems providing surround sound which add excitement to movies and your programs. They offer a unique product called "Bluebolt" with which they can reboot and sometimes repair problems with your electronics from their store without the required service call.



Barney Miller kept the attention of members and guests.

They concluded their visit by providing answers to dozens of questions from the audience.

If you missed this presentation, you missed a very informative show.



Mac & iPad Article

Apple's new iPad Pro – Is it the future of personal computing? Screen size is nearly 13 inches, made to run two apps side by side

The new iPad Pro with optional Smart Keyboard, shown on Apple's web site. The newest Apple tablet goes on sale in November.

Apple's big–screen iPad isn't even available yet – it goes on sale in November. This hasn't kept pundits, tech writers, and others from writing about it.

The big new iPad, called the iPad Pro, features a nearly 13-inch screen, designed to be used by two hands. It also is made to run two apps side—by-side.

In addition, Apple is targeting this new tablet toward businesses. (I would imagine plenty of average consumers will also show an interest in this new iPad because of its giant screen.)

The iPad Pro is designed to be used with two options – a "smart keyboard" which acts as a cover and a device called an Apple Pencil, which is a stylus designed to be used only with this tablet.

Fraser Speirs, who heads up computing and IT at what is believed to be the first school that provided an iPad for every student, believes the new, larger tablet "opens a new chapter in the life of the iPad."

Speirs writes in his blog, "For five years now, the iPad has been the only computer I've actually



wanted to use. I've certainly used Macs and Chromebooks in the meantime but the iPad has always been the one I actively loved."

Speirs admits that many people his age (37 years old) and older dismiss the idea of an iPad replacing a laptop. While the new iPad Pro may not be a laptop replacement for anyone who's spent more than 20 years using a laptop, he says it's all about the future.

"The iPad Pro is the "laptop" for people, who, today, are 12–16 years old who will graduate from high school in the next few years and look for the next–level iOS device to take them to college and beyond into a career. The iPad Pro isn't so much about the iPad Pro today as it is about what it and iOS will become by 2020: Apple's vision for the future of personal computing."

Malicious code found in some iOS apps from Apple's App Store

Apple has confirmed that apps containing malware were being distributed in the company's iOS App Store – the online store with apps made for Apple's mobile devices.

More than 500 million users – most apparently in China – have been impacted by the breach.

Here's how the malware got into those iOS apps, reports Cult of Mac: "The otherwise legit apps were infected by developers who used a counterfeit version of Xcode from Chinese file-sharing service, Baidu, since it was faster to download than the official Apple version of Xcode. Doing so, however, caused the bad code to proliferate and cause this massive iOS security breach."

Xcode is Apple's tool to create software for both iOS devices and the Mac. Instead of relying upon Apple's "safe" version of Xcode, some software developers in China used a version of Xcode that was infected with malware. Therefore, those apps were also infected.

"He told me to cut the legs off the bed. Ain't nobody under there now."



software developers for the company's devices was copied and modified by hackers to put bad code into apps available on the App Store."

Apple says that it has removed the infected apps from the iOS App Store. Some of the most popular apps including Angry Birds 2, SuperJewelsQuest2, Guitar Master, WeChat, Didi Kuaidi, and CamCard were pulled from the App Store.

The *Times* reports that the Chinese online security firm, Qihoo, indicated that it had discovered more than 300 infected apps.

Those have reportedly been pulled and Apple says it is working with software developers to insure that they're using the safe version of Xcode, provided by Apple.

The impact of iOS app developers unknowingly using a rogue version of Xcode is turning out to be greater than initially thought

"Apple has been extremely successful at keeping malware out of the App Store," remarked Ryan Olson, who heads up the threat research team Palo Alto Networks. He told *The New York Times*, that even in this case, hackers didn't actually crack Apple's software. Instead, they relied upon versions of Xcode available on Chinese servers because they load faster than the versions available from Apple.

What should you do? Cult of Mac recommends:

- If you're running any of the affected apps, delete them and wait for a developer patch.
- Keep an eye out for any strange dialogue boxes that appear on the screen of your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch.
- If you find any of the apps on the infected list, change your Apple ID password and be aware of any emails that attempt to get it.

Apps in the Mac App Store were not impacted by this breach.

Adobe releases critical software update to fix nearly two-dozen security holes in Flash

Those of you who read this column know that I've written about security holes in Adobe's Flash player over the past two months.

The patches never end – Adobe patches holes and the bad guys discover new vulnerabilities.

If you need to use Flash, you might want to download Google's Chrome browser and use its Flash plugin rather than installing Flash systemwide. (See the September column for a step-by-step guide on how to activate Flash in the Chrome browser.)

You can tell whether or not Flash is installed systemwide by opening your Mac's System Preferences



and searching for the Flash icon. If it's there, then Flash is installed systemwide.

If you're interested in removing Flash from your Mac, check out AppleInsider's July article:

It tells you how to download an Adobe uninstaller to remove Flash.

Meantime, Brian Krebs, who writes a popular blog about security, writes this about Flash in his mid–September article: "Adobe has released a critical software update to fix nearly two-dozen security holes in its Flash Player browser plugin.

Separately, I want to take a moment to encourage users who have Adobe Shockwave Player installed to finally junk this program; turns out Shockwave — which comes with its own version of Flash — is still many versions behind in bundling the latest Flash fixes."

As I wrote last month, I removed Flash from my Macs. I now use it as a Chrome plug–in, and the only time I use Chrome is to view Flash. The rest of the time I'm using either Firefox (my default browser) or Apple's Safari browser.

iOS 9 adoption rate the fastest in Apple history

In five short days after Apple released iOS 9 to the public, the new mobile operating system had been installed on one—half of all active iPhones, iPads, and iPod touches. Apple reports that is not only the fastest adoption rate of the operating system designed for mobile devices; it's the fastest for any Apple operating system ever.

Here are just some of the new features available in iOS 9:

• **Metal:** Apple says the apps in iOS 9 now take advantage of Metal, making more efficient use of the processor and the electronic circuit to boost image display, faster scrolling, and overall better performance. Metal is also coming to the Mac in OS X El Capitan.

- **Proactive Siri:** Your mobile device's voice assistant can now remind you to remove the coffee from the top of your car when you enter the car, tell you who's calling by searching through your email for a number if that person has emailed you a phone number, and show you pictures of last summer's vacation just by asking for it. Siri predicts what you'll ask and is ready.
- **Split View:** If your iPad has at least 2GB of RAM, you can now open two apps at the same time—side by side. Another related feature called "Slide Over" allows you to open an app in one—third of the screen and then close it when you no longer need it.
- **News:** This new app offers articles provided from a wide range of sources. You can customize your news sources and build your app the way you want it.
- **Notes:** You can add a map, photo or web link to a note and changes to Notes are updated across all Apple devices and to icloud.com. You can tap on the "Share" button and to save attachments to a new or existing note. You can also add bullets with a tap, use the tip of your finger to sketch, and take a photo from within the Notes app.
- **Maps:** A new "Transit" view allows you to see lines and stations for buses, subways, trains and ferries for select cities throughout the world.
- iCloud Drive: This new iOS app allows you to access all of your files you save to iCloud from your device's Home Screen.
- iPad multitasking: Slide Over, Split View & Picture in Picture. Slide Over allows you to open a second app without leaving the one that you're in. Split View allows you to have two apps open and active at the same time. Picture in Picture shrinks your video screen down to a corner

of the iPad's screen. Note: Slide Over and Picture in Picture are available on the iPad Pro, iPad Air or later, and iPad mini 2 or later. Split View is available on the iPad Pro, iPad Air 2, and iPad mini 4.

Better Battery Life: Apple claims that you will get better battery life from your device running iOS 9 – "Across the entire operating system, apps and key technologies have been made more efficient to trim battery usage wherever possible — so you get more battery life for the things you do every day," says Apple's web site. If you have an iPhone 5S or later, "your iPhone knows it's facedown on the table and prevents the screen from turning



on, even when you receive a notification," according to Apple. In addition, Low Power mode lets

you extend battery life even further.

- **Security:** The default for passcodes on the Touch–ID enabled iPhone and iPad is now six, instead of four, digits. Apple says, "With one–million possible combinations, instead of 10,000, your passcode will be a lot tougher to crack." In addition, both iOS 9 and OS X El Capitan on the Mac have built–in support for two–factor authentication.
- Smaller Updates: You might remember that plenty of folks with 16 GB iPads grumbled when they tried to update to iOS 8. The update was hefty and there was not enough room for the installer to work on their iPad. Once the update was installed, it worked fine for most people, but the installer was the problem. Apple apparently learned from that and has now shrunk the installer and the process involved. Apple says, "When it's time for an update, you'll get new notification options that let your device update while you sleep or when you use it least."

This list is the tip of the iceberg. The newest Apple mobile operating system brings many other updates including an improved method of selecting text (move two fingers anywhere on the screen, including over the keyboard, to select, edit and move text); Wallet (Apple Pay); Siri search, and more.

Latest Mac Operating System Is Here – Available for Free Download

El Capitan is its name and Apple has begun offering free downloads of the latest version of OS X for its Mac computers.

Before you install, you may want to read C|Net's article (link at the end of this story).

Folks have been asking me if they should download and install it. My answer? It depends.

If you have an older Mac, I would not install it until I first added more memory to your machine. If your Mac has 4 GB of RAM, I would increase that to 8 GB before installing El Capitan.



Why? Because operating systems LOVE RAM. If your Mac is older, with only 4 GB of RAM, you might do better staying with the current version of OS X that's installed on the machine.

Hardware requirements for El Capitan remain the same as those for OS X Yosemite (El Capitan's predecessor.)


El Capitan will run on these Macs:

- iMac (Mid 2007 or newer)
- MacBook Air (Late 2008 or newer)
- MacBook (Late 2008 Aluminum, or Early 2009 or newer)
- Mac Mini (Early 2009 or newer)
- MacBook Pro (Mid/Late 2007 or newer)
- Mac Pro (Early 2008 or newer)
- Xserve (Early 2009)

Again, just because you can run El Capitan doesn't mean you should. Older Macs may not run as well because they contain older hardware.

Microsoft Office 2016 for Mac standalone & Office 365 versions now available



"Microsoft Office 2016 for Mac is worth the five—year wait it took to get here," writes Edward Mendelson, of PCMag.com.

He adds, "It's still by far the most powerful set of productivity apps for Apple computers, fitting more smoothly into OS X than ever, while adding cloud support."

Before now, Microsoft Office 2016 for Mac was only available for Office 365 subscribers.

That meant to use Office on your Mac, you had to pay a monthly \$9.99 fee to Microsoft (or \$99.99 per year with a yearly subscription.) *Note: Office 2016 for Mac requires OS X 10.10 and a Microsoft online account. Office for the iPad and iPhone require iOS 8 or higher.*

But Office 365 subscribers get to install Office on up to 5 Macs or Windows PCs, or 5 tablets, or 5 phones (includes Apple, Windows and Android devices.) You can mix up to five devices. Let's say I have two Macs, two iPads, and an iPhone. You could install Office 2016 for Mac on the two Macintosh computers, and a version of Office made for the iPad and iPhone on those mobile devices.

Office 2016 for the Mac includes new versions of Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook.

Users also get 1TB of OneDrive cloud storage per user, for up to 5 users.

The cost of the standalone "one–time purchase" of Office Home & Student 2016 for Mac is \$149.99 and can only be installed on one Mac. It also provides 15 GB of online storage in Microsoft's One Drive cloud storage system.

Meanwhile, Microsoft offers a free version of Office similar to the much—used Google Docs in addition to Apple's iCloud.com web site.

You can open a web browser and get access to all of the documents you've created using Microsoft Office on your Mac, iPad, or other device on which Office is installed.

It's clear that Mendelson is quite impressed with the new Mac version of Office. PCMag rates the software as "excellent" (a rarity), and closes his review by saying, "There's no contest for our Editors' Choice for OS X office suites: Office for the Mac is the clear winner."

But Chris Phin, who writes for Techradar Pro, says the new Office is hard to justify when Mac users have Pages, Numbers and Keynote and Google Docs via the Web: "Taken in the abstract, this is a superb office suite, and we welcome what's happened on and under the surface – even if some of the areas for further improvement are glaringly obvious. But on the Mac, where iWork is effectively free for many, and in a world where Google's web apps do collaborative working better, it's harder than ever to justify."

iPad app, WunderMap, just might make you wonder about the weather

Imagine if there was an app for your iPad that not only provided regional weather conditions, but also gave you a snapshot of weather in your own neighborhood.

WunderMap, a free app from the folks at Weather Underground, fits that bill. The folks at *Macworld* like it so much, they rated it 4 ½ stars.



WunderMap pulls data from the world's largest network of personal weather stations – including temperature, dew point, humidity, wind speed, wind direction and pressure, and precipitation.



The WunderMap app allows the user to choose a variety of weather stations and organize them for viewing. Apple mobile devices that can run WunderMap include the iPad 2, iPod touch (6th generation), iPad (4th generation with 4G capabilities), iPad mini, iPhone 4S, iPhone 5, iPhone 5s, iPhone 6, and iPhone 6 Plus.
